

Impact Ventures Corporation (IVC) is a 501© (3) charitable nonprofit organization rising to the challenge of addressing the critical need for veteran affordable housing.

The lack of affordable housing for vets causes serious social stability problems for vets transitioning to civilian life, which substantially contributes to the increased rate of veteran suicides and is 1.5 times higher among all veterans, and 2.1 times higher among female veterans compared with the general population.

Veterans face unique underfunded challenges transitioning to civil life and face a 50% higher suicide rate than civilians due to PTSD, increased stress, and traumatic injury from combat duty not experienced by American civilians. The main cause of this disparity in funding is a \$15B deficit in VA budgetary allocations due to the rising demand and complexity of VA services that promote wellness, affordable housing, veteran career development, life coach and entrepreneurship opportunities for transitioning veterans.

The Problem

Veterans face unique emotional problems like generalized anxiety, depression, isolation, MST and PTSD resulting from their experience during military service. PTSD in veterans is primarily caused by experiencing or witnessing traumatic events during military service, such as combat exposure, acts of war, or sexual assault. Other factors, including previous trauma and individual susceptibility can also contribute to the development of PTSD. Despite these issues, historically there has been significant funding gaps (\$15B) in government sponsored veteran support services and demand.

Only 47% of all **veterans** access the US Department of **Veterans** Affairs (VA) healthcare system, which leaves 53% not receiving health care, or receiving it outside the VA. Inadequate veteran services cause significant financial damage and increased public spending on healthcare, housing, wellness programs, with reduced economic contributions from veterans due to emotional issues, unemployment, poverty, and other hardships. This places a greater burden on taxpayers and negatively affects the security, broader economy and contributes to the increased suicide rate for veterans!

Veteran programs face significant challenges with funding, efficiency, accountability, and allocation of adequate veteran resources. This is why we are creating affordable housing communities for veterans because it is the cornerstone for veteran stability which improves overall health, well-being and secure employment.

Stable housing provides a foundation for veterans to access other resources, such as healthcare, mental health support services, and career development opportunities. It is a fundamental step to ending veteran housing problems, homelessness, and suicide, especially for those with service-connected disabilities, PTSD and other challenges. PTSD in veterans is primarily caused by experiencing or witnessing traumatic events during military service, such as combat exposure, acts of war, or sexual assault. Other factors, including previous trauma and individual susceptibility, can also contribute to the development of PTSD.

Government veteran housing programs are not a universal successful, having achieved significant success in reducing veteran homelessness, particularly through initiatives like HUD-VASH, but they face challenges like inconsistent funding, administrative issues, and gaps in supporting services like mental healthcare and case management. While some government veteran programs excel, others show high rates of housing instability with the effectiveness of these programs impacted by politics, lack of robust partnerships, accurate data, and insufficient financial resources to keep pace with growing demand.

IVC helps close veteran service funding gaps bridging the divide between government resources, and demand for excellent accommodations.
